*Anyone wishing to understand the issue of animal cruelty, the animal cruelty laws; and, their enforcement may and should attend this course.* This includes animal control officers, kennel managers, shelter workers, rescue group personnel, and volunteers. Successful completion of this course is required for appointment as an Animal Cruelty Investigator by a New Jersey Municipality and meets the requirements of N.J.A.C. 8:23A-2.6.

Enrollment is open to any person 18 years of age or older. While enrollment is limited we hope to accommodate all applicants.

The course will be held on seven weekdays from Apr 30 - May 8, 2012. Classes will be held from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm each day. The dress code for this class is business attire or uniforms. Completion of the course requires attendance at all classes. Tuition for this seven-day program is \$699, which includes all materials.
